Program Criteria, Description, and Goals

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PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

In collaboration with the classroom teachers and other stakeholders, the teacher will create a schedule for each school and grade level. Grades 1-12 G&T classes will convene from October through June and Kindergarten will convene from February through June. Classes will be scheduled weekly for a forty-minute period. The G&T Curriculum was created to address the needs of our gifted and twice-exceptional students. Students will be assessed throughout the program but grades will not be provided for this class on the report card. Parents will be required to sign off on a consent to participate form in order for their child to participate in the pull-out services.

PROGRAM GOALS

The Gifted & Talented program is designed to meet the needs of students identified as requiring enrichment in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Lakewood Public School District strives to:

- Challenge gifted and talented students who demonstrate a need for rigor beyond the regular curriculum for their grade level.
- Provide an environment that encourages the development of critical thinking skills such as analysis, evaluation, synthesis, and complex problem-solving strategies.
- Provide an environment that encourages divergent thinking and supports the development of originality, fluency, flexibility, and elaboration.
- Develop confidence in expressing ideas in discussions and written form.
- Provide students with opportunities to develop leadership skills through positive group interaction.
- Encourage a lifelong commitment to independent learning.
- The G&T program promotes an increase of metacognitive awareness in:
 - ELA: the application of comprehension strategies, synthesizing information from multiple sources across various genres, engaging in discussions based on textual analysis and evaluation, and responding to literature in sophisticated written form.

- Math: the utilization of number sense strategies, applying multiple skills to model and solve real-world scenarios, participating in mathematical discourse with a focus on defending or supporting a conjecture, generalizing mathematical processes and procedures, and strengthening conceptual understanding of mathematical principles and ideas.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Kindergarten Math G&T CRITERIA

In the Fall, all students in Kindergarten will be assessed via the iReady Diagnostic and the Unit 1 and Unit 2 math assessments. Scores at or above the 95th percentile on the

iReady Diagnostic along with Unit 1 and Unit 2 scores above 90 will be analyzed and the top 3-5% will be selected to participate in the Math G&T program for Grade K.

Grades 1-5 Math G&T CRITERIA

At the start of each school year, all students in Grades 1-5 will be assessed via the iReady Diagnostic and the Beginning of the Year Math Assessment. Students with the highest scores in the grade level at the school level will be considered. The BoY assessment along with the End of Year diagnostic from the previous year will be used as supporting data along with teacher input, if necessary. The top 3-5% will be selected to participate in the Math G&T program for Grades 1-5.

9-12 Math G&T CRITERIA

Students already in the Honors / G&T program must maintain an A average to continue in the G&T program. Teachers can recommend new students to the program provided the student has earned a high A average in the prerequisite course(s).

In June of the previous school year, math teachers submitted written recommendations for incoming 9-12 student placement in the G&T courses. Final grades were used to

substantiate the recommendations. Recommendations and final grades were reviewed for selection into the G&T program.

K-2 ELA G&T CRITERIA

In September, all first and second-grade students will be assessed via Istation and DIBELS 8. Teachers will input the scores into LinkIt and the company will create a Ranking Report of students' performance. The top 5-10 students or the top 5% of students per grade level, per school, will be identified for G&T services. Once students are identified, pertinent teachers will be consulted by the G&T teacher to confirm their suitability for the services. The same process will be followed for Kindergarten but students in that grade level will be tested in January and they will be serviced from February through June of each school year.

3-5 ELA G&T CRITERIA

At the start of each school year, all students in Grades 3-5 will be assessed via the *Istation Diagnostic* and the *Beginning of Year ELA Assessment*. Students with the highest scores in the grade level at the school level will be considered. *The Beginning of Year Assessment* along with the *End of Year Assessment* from the previous year will be used as supporting data along with teacher input, if necessary. The top 3-5% will be selected to participate in the ELA G&T program for Grades 3-5.

9-12 ELA G&T CRITERIA

Students already in the Honors / G&T program must maintain an A average to continue in the G&T program. Teachers can recommend new students to the program provided the student has earned a high A average in the prerequisite course(s).

ASSESSMENTS

K-5 ASSESSMENT

All G&T K-5 students will be progress monitored using the District's 3 Universal Screening instruments (Istation, DIBELS, and iReady) three times per year. In addition, students will be formatively assessed via checks for understanding, independent work, assignments, projects, quizzes, and participation.

6-12 ASSESSMENTS

Unit assessments on course content will be administered 3 times per marking period. In addition, students will be formatively assessed via Checks for Understanding, DoLs, written assignments, homework, and class participation. All students will take a benchmark assessment at the beginning, middle, and end of the year. Assessment data will be analyzed by the teacher and shared with students and administration to promote discourse, determine student success in the course, and inform interventions and supports.
