# What to do if You Suspect Your Child Is Being Bullied

FEBRUARY 20, 2023

## Board Policy

The Board of Education prohibits acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying of a pupil. A safe and civil environment in schools is necessary for students to learn and achieve high academic standards. Harassment, intimidation, or bullying, like other disruptive/violent behaviors, is conduct that disrupts both a student's ability to learn and a school's ability to educate in a safe and disciplined environment. In all such instances, such behavior will not be tolerated and will be addressed according to Board Policy.

The Board expects pupils to conduct themselves in keeping with their levels of development, maturity, and demonstrated capabilities with proper regard for the rights and welfare of other pupils and school staff, the educational purpose underlying all school activities and the care of school facilities and equipment consistent with the Code of Pupil Conduct.

## Bullying v. Conflict

#### **Bullying:**

- Intentional, unwanted, aggressive behavior.
- Involves a real or perceived power imbalance.
- Intended to demean, insult or hurt someone.
- Does not stop when asked.

#### Conflict:

A misunderstanding or disagreement that causes emotional reaction between two or more connected people.

- A. All parties have equal power to solve the problem
- B. All parties have an equal interest in the outcome
- C. A conflict can be resolved by talking or working things out together or with help from an adult

## Types of Bullying

### There are three types of bullying:

- 1. Verbal
- 2. Social
- 3. Physical



## Verbal Bullying

**Verbal bullying** is saying or writing mean things. Verbal bullying includes:

- Teasing
- Name-calling
- Inappropriate sexual comments
- Taunting
- Threatening to cause harm



## Social Bullying

**Social bullying**, sometimes referred to as relational bullying, involves hurting someone's reputation or relationships. Social bullying includes:

- Leaving someone out on purpose
- Telling other children not to be friends with someone
- Spreading rumors about someone
- Embarrassing someone in public



## Physical Bullying

- Physical bullying involves hurting a person's body or possessions. Physical bullying includes:
  - Hitting/kicking/pinching
  - Spitting
  - Tripping/pushing
  - Taking or breaking someone's things
  - Making mean or rude hand gestures



## Cyberbullying

Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place over digital devices like cell phones, computers, and tablets. Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else. It can include sharing personal or private information about someone else causing embarrassment or humiliation. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behavior.

The most common places where cyberbullying occurs are:

- Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, and Twitter
- Text Messages
- Messenger



## What to do if Your Child is the Target of Cyberbullying

- Do not respond to and do not forward messages to friends.
- Save messages, take screenshots images, and record time/date it occured.
- Report immediately!
- Block the bully!
- Report the user to the social media site they are in violation of terms and conditions.

\*We can investigate cyberbullying cases even if it did not occur during school hours.



## What happens after you report suspected bullying?

- > A HIB Investigation must be completed within 10 days
- > A written report is submitted to the Principal, then to the Superintendent.
- A report is reviewed and submitted to the Board of Education.
- Final reports are submitted to NJ Department of Education.

## Students who **violate** the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights:

► Students who *violate* the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights, <u>must complete a two (2)</u> hour online Bullying Awareness and Prevention course, in addition to consequences as assigned by the Principal, as per the 2022-2023 Code-of-Conduct.

## Students who **Fight** in School

Students who fight in school, or on school grounds, must <u>complete a four (4)</u> <u>hour Conflict Resolution</u> course, in addition to consequences as assigned by the Principal, as per the 2022-2023 Code-of-Conduct.


